- WHAT:** An inline skating training camp on a beautiful bank track in hot sunny Mexico
- SKILL LEVEL:** Two groups, intermediate and elite
- SPACES:** Maximum of 20 registrants
- WHEN:** March 8 – 14, 2009
- WHERE:** Merida, Yucatan
- COSTS:** \$200 for the Training Camp
\$65 for the transportation and touring stops from Cancun to Merida (estimated)
\$50 for the road skate to Uxmal (estimated, optional)
\$300 for a hotel room in Merida for 6 nights (approx)
(approx. \$150 per person for a double and about \$90 for a quad)

TRANSPORTATION: Find your own flight to Cancun. We will help you arrange transportation via transport coach back to Cancun for your return flight home, or you can fly home directly from Merida, or you can stay a little longer and enjoy the beautiful Yucatan peninsula.

This year for Skate Mexico we will return to beautiful Merida, Yucatan for a one-week training camp with former sprinting champion and current head coach of the Yucatan team, Jorge Santiago Gordillo. (Copa Chiapaneca Mexicanidad will not take place in 2009.)

This year, our special guest coach multiple world champion Joey Mantia will host us for a special two-day clinic.

Our private coach will leave from Cancun on Sunday, March 8th at 9:00 a.m. Enroute to Merida, we will partake in a day tour of parts of the Yucatan peninsula including visiting the Cenotes at Dzitnip, so bring your swimsuits and your snorkelling gear. The cost of us hiring the bus is approximately \$65 per person.

Once again we will be staying at the Hotel Dolores Alba in Merida. The hotel is a well-maintained 3-star hotel with modern amenities like a swimming pool and wireless internet and was very well reviewed by last-year's attendees of Skate Mexico. Rates for the hotel are approximately \$50 per room per night and singles, doubles and quads are available.

Training takes place at the Yucatan 200m bank track and begins on Monday and continues every day until Friday. The format will be slightly different this year, with morning sessions being dedicated to intermediate sessions and the afternoon sessions dedicated to the elites. Skaters are welcome to attend both session but should be respectful of the audience for which the session is dedicated.

On Saturday morning of the 14th of March, we will repeat our road skate, which ends at the famous pyramids at Uxmal. After relaxing at the archaeological site, we will be escorted back to Merida to prepare for our various departures.
